Stewardship Reflection:

"Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the Scriptures to us?" (Luke 24:32)

A thought from todays 2nd Reading: 1 Pet. 18, 19

¹⁸ You know that you were ransomed ... not with perishable things like silver or gold, ¹⁹ but with the precious blood of Christ ...

Slavery was common in the ancient world. It exists even today in various subtle ways. If someone pays enough money for you (the slave himself is powerless to do this), you can be free!

Peter compares human condition to slavery. Through sin we have become slaves of the evil one. The only one who can buy us back is God Himself. We are powerless to do it on our own. God becomes man in Christ and pays with his blood (i.e. his life) to buy us back from slavery. Now, we can be free if we bind ourselves to Christ. This is the meaning of surrendering ourselves to Christ. He has already paid for us in full. We need to claim it by allowing Him to mark us with His blood!

Do we accept *Jesus' freedom* or prefer the 'freedom of the devil' which is slavery now and for eternity.
