Stewardship Reflection:

"So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O Lord, have given me." (Deuteronomy 26:10)

Second, do you realize that everything you have and that everything you are has been given to you by God? Ask God for a grateful and generous heart, every day, in all circumstances.

(Here is an excerpt from the letter of *Richard and Agnieszka Lichtenberg*:)

Hello Canada.

Well, Tanks, helicopters, multinational forces are all around here. We purchased our farm really close to the Ukrainian border. You should see it here now. Gas and all fuels are rationed.

We've just opened up our place for Ukrainian refugees and they are coming. We have contacts and friends with the Ukrainian Catholic Church and convents.

I've never done fundraising before but we are over our heads and this is just the beginning of the conflict. We need tents, food, clothes, medical supplies, diapers and things that I can't even think of yet.

Young Ukrainian families are coming here to Poland and just hang out at the border. The fathers and men have to stay and fight while the women and children are allowed to leave the conflict.

We ask for your prayers and help. Maybe someone from our Parish has a family in Ukraine. We can give them somewhere safe to sleep but we are tapped out for funds and are not budgeted for anyone else.

I'm passing out tired from stress and I hope that I'm making some sense. Please pass this on to Father George, unless there is a new Parish Priest at St. Joseph's already.
