- ➤ NO clothing, NO used books, NO used electronics.

Monetary donations for the Bazaar are always welcome. Simply write out a cheque to St. Joseph's Parish with a notation on the memo line that it is for the Bazaar. Put your donation in an envelope and drop it into the collection basket on Sunday or bring your donation to the office. If your donation is \$20 or over you will receive a tax deductible receipt.

Following are some suggested items appropriate for the different booths. We need a lot of items!

BAKE TABLE: Bread, buns, cookies, pies, squares, cakes, sweet loaves, Nanaimo bars, lemon bars, Christmas cakes, Gingerbread houses, tarts, brownies, pound cakes. Whatever you bake that gets second requests. You have time to practice for this one since the items will only be brought to the Bob Stevens Hall the afternoon/evening before the Bazaar.

BOTTLE BOOTH: All you need to do is go out and buy a bottle of something and drop the bottle(s) in the box. This is a great way for you to contribute to the Bazaar. Bottles must be clean, not partially filled, and ingredients must not be out-dated. *Spices, shampoo, liquid soap,. pop, jams, nuts, packaged candies put in a bottle, small coins in a bottle.* Bottles must be filled and sealed.

CARMESA: A Portuguese number game. Good quality items. *Ornaments, perfumes, tea towels, face cloths, spice set, kitchen items, mixing bowls, china, salt & pepper sets, steak knife sets, first aid kits, cup & saucer sets, cosmetic items, wooden toys, measuring spoons, measuring cups, new picture frames, vases. Use your imagination and bring in non-bulky items.*

CRAFTS: Knitters, Crocheters, Sewers and Craft people - we're counting on you to let your talent shine by donating some quality work. *Tea cozies, place mats, aprons, quilted work, embroidery work, crocheted items, baby blankets, knitted socks, baby blankets, table cloths, dish cloths, handmade wooden toys, handmade Christmas items, etc., etc.*

JEWELLERY: New or slightly used jewellery of various shapes and sizes. *Hair accessories, bangles, bracelets, scarves, belts, etc.*

The baskets should not be too large or too small. Themed baskets can be made. List the items that are in your basket and pin the list to the basket. Knowing what's in the basket helps in selling the paddles

. Tinned or boxed nuts, tinned or boxed chocolates, tinned or boxed cookies, glass containers, Christmas food stuffs, dinner plate set, tea kettle, Christmas dishes, games, theatre tickets, boxes of mandarin oranges (purchased the week of the Bazaar), baking set, etc., etc.

SANTA'S WORKSHOP: Items must be NEW or NEAR-NEW, WASHED & CLEAN. We want Moms & Dads to know that everything is safe. *Puzzles, boxed games, stuffed animals, little cars, computer games, toys, sports equipment, etc., etc.*

TEA ROOM: The foyer is transformed, it becomes a great place to just relax and enjoy a *fantastic cup of* tea or coffee, fancy sandwiches and delicious homemade squares.

TOUCH & TAKE: A surprise awaits in the wrapped grab bags. Donated items should be new and small. Paint brushes, playing cards, small kitchen items, match box toys, bath products, combs, brushes, dolls, nail polish, hockey or baseball cads, bouncy balls, party favours, crayons, pencils, pens, erasers.
