GUIDELINES for GODPARENTS

You may already have someone in mind for being a godparent for your child's baptism. Pause for a moment. The Church has specific expectations on who can fulfill this role. It's not just a matter of who you like but, also, will they be able to fulfill this religious role.

- 1. You need to have at least *one* godparent for your child's baptism. You do *not* need to have two. It is our practice to have the godparent(s) get a form signed by their parish priest to admit them to this role. The godparent must be:
 - (a) a Catholic who has been Confirmed and received Holy Communion,
 - (b) practices his/her faith (including going to Mass regularly),
 - (c) not less than 16 years of age,
 - (d) neither a parent of the one being baptized,
 - (e) nor labour under a Church penalty.

If the person does not meet these requirements, you must look for another. Do not ask someone to get the form signed if they do not qualify; you run the risk of unnecessarily embarrassing your potential godparent when the priest refuses to sign it.

- 2. If you are submitting a second name, this person needs to be of the opposite gender from the first, and be a baptized, believing Christian. If they fulfill the items in (1) above, they are a second godparent and you need not read any further in this paragraph. But, while this would be most appropriate, the second person does not need to be a practicing Catholic or even a Catholic. They must be, as just stated above, a baptized, believing Christian. When this second person is not able to have the Godparent Form signed by a Catholic priest (i.e. they are a Catholic who doesn't practice the faith regularly or they are not Catholic) then they go down in our register and on the baptism certificate as a Christian Witness.
- 3. Our register has place only for two Godparents.
